My Faith Journey

Now I know that my faith has always been part of my life since I was baptized. However, there were many years when I went about my daily life and did not notice it, feel it or even think about it. Now I know it must have been there all along. Yet, there was no specific time when I recognized, “Hey, God is working faith in me!” Instead, it has been a subtle, gradual knowing that God is at work in me—and it took other people to help me realize that. With the gift of hindsight, I look at how things have turned out and realize that other people and their faith actually got me through some of the stuff that has happened in my life.

One of the most amazing things about faith has to be the community of faith that we share with others. I have realized that God has worked my faith through others. On my own, I am not sure I would have figured that out! A number of years ago, my friend, Linda Tokoi, made a comment at a circle Bible Study that has stuck with me a long time. She said, “I find Jesus in others . . . in my friends, in the people at church . . . it is where Jesus is.” I think she is right. This is the community of faith working towards what God intends us to do.

Working together, we can share our good and bad times and be strengthened to help those in need. So, when I am in a tough situation, I have learned to continue praying, get support from others, decide what I can actually do about the problem, and then watch how God works through people in my life to guide me to a solution. Sometimes resolution comes quickly, but mostly it takes time and patience. Also, there are those times when I do not “see” the answer. But then, someone will say something and “Aha!” The answer is clear to me. It must be the community of faith at work!

Last week, I read a sermon that Pastor Larry Keene gave at the church where he is interim pastor. It was his first Sunday back in the pulpit since he had been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. He writes how he found himself overwhelmed by the tremendous caring his family, friends and the people in his congregation showed for him especially since he had only been their pastor a few weeks before he had to have surgery and treatment. He writes, “And Christ showed up. And my soul was healed. I was no longer lost in the darkness. Christ showed up in you and them. That is what it means that God chose to come to us as a man: the heart of God will always be revealed through the human. As Martin Luther put it, we become ‘little Christs’ to one another.” Again, God working through us . . . the community of faith!

So, I am grateful to the people who are in the community of faith I know: my family, friends, and the members at Zion. We work together to minister to each other. We work together to make the world a better place for all. As God intended. Hooray!

Pastor's Corner

February 2012

"In quietness and in trust shall be your strength."

- Isaiah 30:15

Proverbs 25:19 notes that trust in a faithless person in a time of trouble is like a bad tooth or a lame foot. Sometimes it is wise to be skeptical about trusting someone, especially if one cannot rely on a person having a needed ability or if one is not confident in a person's integrity. In other words, it is right of you to not board an airplane with me as the pilot--I do not have any training! Plus, it is indeed wise to not entrust all your investments to a stranger off the street! My examples may be extreme, but they make the point. There are times to be wary in trusting others.

However, there are also times to rely on others. We place our confidence in truth, abilities, honesty, strength, integrity, and reliability of people—or things. We have confidence because of good reasons, definite evidence, or past experience. I fly in planes because of their overall safety record. I listen to certain advisors because of the wisdom that they have given me in the past. Sometimes this trust is connected to positions of authority; sometimes not. Think for a moment: Where would we be if we did not trust others—or things? Besides encouraging a feeling of security, trust also engenders freedom and offers opportunity.

Trust. Whom do we trust? How much do we trust? One of my favorite quotes from Jesus is this: "See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves" (Matthew 10:16). We are called to embody this creative tension. Thomas Watson once wrote,

*We must have innocence with our wisdom—or else our wisdom is but craftiness;
and we must have wisdom with our innocence—or else our innocence is but weakness.*

*We must have the innocence of the dove that we may not harm others and
we must have the wisdom of the serpent that others may not harm us.*

We have to trust ourselves in discerning whom to trust and how much to trust!

However, trusting ourselves is not always easy. We can know something deep within us, but sometimes we cannot give it voice. As humans, it is natural that we can get caught by fear or insecurity or some memory from our past—and we do not trust ourselves. We can also swing to the other extreme where we are self-righteous, thinking and saying that we are always right—but not realizing that maybe it is not such a good idea to trust ourselves so much! Sometimes we can discover and admit how wrong we were—sometimes we cannot.

Trust. What does it mean to trust? For me, trusting myself is connected to trusting God. It is in this relationship that I am able to note what is really going on inside of me and to see what "gods" I am worshipping. As Psalm 40:4 says. "Happy are those who make the LORD their trust, who do not turn to the proud, to those who go astray after false gods." Also, it is in this relationship that I claim my gifts, look at what I have to offer, and seek God's guidance and blessing. As Psalm 37:5 notes, "Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act."

When you face decisions or times of uncertainty, think about trust. Live in its creative tension that calls you to discern with wisdom and innocence. Ask questions so that you reconsider people, things, and self from different perspectives. Acknowledge that you have a voice plus various options. Recognize the interplay between trusting others, trusting yourself, and trusting God. And know this: God trusts in your ability to do this as an individual within the community. As it says in Isaiah, "In quietness and in trust shall be your strength."
